#### **Affidavit Regarding Counselor Conduct and Camper-Counselor Contact**

# Name Guidelines for the discipline of Children:

- I understand and accept the following:
- 1. Counselors may, under no circumstances, hit a child.
  - 2. Counselors may not use abusive or derogatory language with campers.
  - 3. Counselors need to ask for help.
  - 4. A staff member who encounters a particularly difficult child will seek the assistance of a supervisor or administrative staff.
  - 5. In all dealings with campers, counselors should strive to respond as opposed to react to children.

## **Guidelines for Camper- Counselor contact:**

I understand and accept that when touching campers, the following guidelines should be followed:

- On the hand, shoulder or upper back;
- Never against a child's will (unless in the case of clear and present danger of the
- Never against a child's discomfort, whether expressed verbally or non-verbally;
- <sup>35</sup> In the company of other adults
- Never when it would have the effect of over-stimulating a child;
- $^{35}_{17}$  Never in a place on a child's body that is normally covered by a bathing suit, unless for a clear medical necessity, and then only with supervision of another adult.

### **Counselor Responsibility:**

- <sup>35</sup> I understand and accept that I am a care-taker of children.
- <sup>35</sup> I understand that there is a clear **power difference** between myself and campers (money, mobility, authority, experience, knowledge, different set of rules).
- I understand that inappropriate conduct with campers- physically and psychologically can have a lasting and negative impact on campers.

#### **Guidelines for staff:**

I understand and accept the following:

- There is no hazing of campers by campers or counselors;
- <sup>35</sup> Campers will not be subjected to initiation rites that are abusive in any manner;
- <sup>35</sup> Campers will not be alone with a counselor in his or her quarters;
- <sup>35</sup> A staff member will under no circumstances share a bed with a camper;
- Counselors will set limits with children who "cling or hang on them":
- Counselors will not give back rubs or massage campers;
- Tickling or teasing a camper to the point where the camper is out of control is not acceptable:
- Fillow fights or wrestling matches and the like can become over-stimulating in short order and need to be limited or avoided;
- Romantic lives of counselors can, under no circumstance, be shared with campers;
- <sup>35</sup> Counselors should stay out of tents after lights out at night unless there is an urgent
- Male staff working with adolescent female campers need to be aware of the tendency for this group to develop hidden or secret fantasies and crushes;
- Whatever is done with campers should be done in broad daylight, preferably with company!

#### Other Instructions:

I agree to the following:

- To watch for signs of stress in myself and others as a way of maintaining a safe environment at camp.
- To help other staff who seem at risk for hurting or abusing campers.
- To alert administrative personnel to dangerous or "at risk" situations between campers and staff.
- To ask for more supervision, intervention or support if needed.
- To seek help myself if I feel at risk for hurting, over stimulating or abusing a camper.
